




"Autumn Storm Rising" 24 x 30 Oil - \$3,000 Julie Davis

Julie Davis was born in Galveston, Texas, and was raised in towns across West Texas from El Paso to Abilene. She grew up drawing and creating and earned degrees from Baylor University in education and law. After she and her husband started a family, Davis worked as a freelance writer and explored black and white photography, photographing the landscape and her daughters, and learning much about composition and light in the process. In 2007, she had the opportunity to study oil painting and quickly learned that it brought all her interests and skills together—her adoration of the outdoors, drawing, photography, writing, even law-all of it had a place in making art. She studied with some of the preeminent landscape painters in the country and continues to challenge




herself so that she might elegantly demonstrate her respect for our landscape on canvas. Davis and her husband live in Austin and have three adult daughters.

"Our experiences with the landscape are as unique as each of us. When I go outside with my plein air gear, I'm looking for locations that draw an emotional response from me. I try to build a painting that communicates an authentic reflection of my reverence for and my individual expression of our environment. I love the pursuit to understand a place that painting outdoors requires. The land always has a story to tell, and there is beauty in that. I do my best to understand the story within every subject I paint."

A Signature Member of OPA, AIS, and AWA, Davis has been juried into OPA, AIS, and AWA national shows. Her plein air work earned Best of Show in the 2023 American Impressionist Society Wet Wall Competition at the Small Works Showcase by Judge Anne Blair Brown, in the 2019 American Impressionist Society / Southwest Art All-Member Central Park Plein Air Paint Out in New York City by Judge Kevin Macpherson, and in the 2013 and the 2014 Kerrville Outdoor Painter's Events in Texas. Most recently, she earned an Award of Excellence at the OPA Masters show from judge Scott Christensen



Susan Diehl was born on July 20th, 1957, in Sheboygan, WI. From when she was little, Susan found a place in drawing she could go to for solace and joy. It is from this place that she paints today. Although she studied fine art at the University of Wisconsin, she felt her studies began in earnest when she met Ron Lukas (now the art director at Dream Works

Studio) and studied in the Russian Impressionist style, learning painting skills in the time-honored tradition, mentor to student. For seven years, Susan studied painting while painting signs and raising their children with her husband, Douglas.

Susan continued to hone her skills studying with great artists such as Bill Reese and Del Gish. Susan's subject matter tends to be inspired by man's interaction with nature and the capturing of special archetypal moments in time. Many times, a hint of the human element will creep into a landscape, a boat by a pond, or a wheelbarrow in the field. She is keenly interested in color and light, shape, and pattern. Susan's versatility and knowledge allows her to paint whatever she wishes, from still life and landscape to her favorite, figures interacting with their


"Still Life with Lilacs" 20 x 24 Oil - \$3,200 Eric Jacobsen



Eric Jacobsen was born and raised in New England. He studied fine art at the Lyme Academy of Fine Arts in Old Lyme, CT from 1991-1995. At the Academy he received training in the Beaux Arts tradition of drawing and painting from life. His true inspiration is the amazing beauty that he sees in nature. Jacobsen is a "Plein Air" painter. He takes his oils wherever he goes, setting up on site, working until his painting is finished. Eric shows his work nationwide and has won several awards including in 2004 an "Award of Merit" at the Oil Painters of America NW Regional Exhibition which was held at the Howard Mandville Gallery in Kirkland, WA. In 2005 he was awarded the "Utrecht Award of Excellence" at the Oil Painters of America National Exhibition held at Hilligoss Galleries, Chicago, IL. Eric currently resides with his wife and children in Maine.




"Back Road" 10 x 20 Oil - \$1,400 Eric Jacobsen

"It is most important to me that my paintings convey a certain mood. I want them to be felt by the viewer without his or her having to analyze or think about them. As a general rule, I try to find strong compositions in nature and then paint the scene accurately while leaving out any extraneous details which would only busy up the painting and detract from the strength of the piece as a whole. My painting process consists of finding a painting site and setting up to paint for a couple of hours, or until the light has changed. For larger paintings, I will return on consecutive days at the same time, under similar lighting conditions to finish a piece."




